

Ariake Sea


The Ariake Sea, which can be seen


from Saga Prefecture, has the maximum tidal range of 6 meters.

The Yoshinogari ruins are one of Japan's largest ruins of moat settlements of the Yayoi period (300 BC -250 AD). The Yoshinogari settlement lasted about 700 years from (at its peak) is reproduced in the park to preserve the precious cultural heritage.

Nicknamed "Azalea Temple," this temple is a favorite spot for people to enjoy azalea blossoms in spring and colored leaves in autumn.




Saga has both mountainous and coastal areas, with a bright, clear sky up above. Enjoy Saga's beautiful nature!

Terraced Rice Fields in Hamanoura


Genkai Town

Ureshino "Onsen" **Hot Springs**

Ureshino City

With its 1300-year history, Ureshino Onsen has many traditional Japanese-style inns that produce an old-style atmosphere. Ureshino Onsen is also known as one of the three most famous beautifying hot springs of Japan.

Takeo "Onsen" Hot Springs

Featuring the velvety soft water of its hot springs, Takeo Onsen is a historic hot spring resort that was mentioned in the Hizen Fudoki (a record of the natural features, culture and history of the Hizen area-the area that includes present-day Saga and Nagasaki Prefectures) written around 1,300 years ago. A vermillion-lacquered, two-story gate standing at the resort's entrance is a must-see.



Furuyu·Kumanokawa "Onsen" **Hot Springs**

Fuji Town, Saga City

Characterized by its tepid and slimy soft water, hot springs have attracted many great artistic and literary figures.



Saga Prefecture Space & Science Museum

One of the largest natural science complexes in the Kyushu region, the museum has 5 hands-on space science exhibition zones, as well as an observatory and a planetarium with the latest projection equipment.

Tanjoin Temple

Kashima City

This temple features beautiful plum and cherry blossoms, as well as elegant pine trees. You can enjoy transcribing Buddhist sutra in Tanjoin Hall, adjacent to the Main Hall. (Reservation required).

Hizen Yumekaido

Streets of a town in the Edo period (1603-1868), where samurais and princesses walk around, are reproduced in this history theme park. The Ninja experience programs offered in the park are very popular.





Saga Nishiki Textile

Saga Nishiki features delicate and gorgeous geometric patterns created by weaving using silk as the woof, and gold, silver or lacquer as the warp.

Hizen-Nao Japanese Paper

Yamato Town, Saga City

Various types of handmade Japanese paper sheets are available depending on the purposes of use, such as wallpaper and lampshades.

Furyumen Masks

Kashima City

Furyumen are devil masks in which you can see the painstaking craftsmanship. These masks are worn by people dancing the "Memburyu," a traditional folk performing art.



Hizen Vidro Glassware

Europeans since the Edo period.

Hizen Vidro uses a traditional technique known as "Japanese blowing," which shapes glass into objects by blowing alone, without the use of molds. This is a phantom technique that cannot be seen anymore anywhere else in Japan. Enjoy this glassware's subtle beauty.

Ogi Yokan Sweet Bean Jelly

Ogi Yokan is an elegant sweet made mainly of Ogi's clear natural water and carefully-selected red beans. It is one of the traditional sweets of Saga.



Takezaki Crabs

Takezaki Crabs are a kind of blue crab. The recommended way to cook them is to boil in salted water. Drinking sake poured into the hollowed shell and mixed with the tomalley is also recommended.

Saga International Balloon Festa


Saga City
